



Intro to Computer Science 4653



This course is an introduction to computer science for students with no prior experience. Students learn to program in JavaScript, a professional language used across the web, while starting off in a fun, friendly and accessible environment. Computer programming is done through CodeHS. CodeHS is an online program that helps high schools teach computer science. CodeHS is built specifically for high school students with no previous background. It provides step-by-step curriculum with short videos, example code and programming exercises to learn from. Students watch their code come to life in the browser without having to download anything.

Guidelines and Requirements

MATERIALS:

- 3-ring binder
- Binder dividers

- Laptop computer (Provided)



BINDER:

All students must keep a binder for class to hold all handouts and assignments.

Grade Reports

1. Grade reports will be distributed to each student every 2 weeks via paper copy and email.
2. You are expected to get it signed by a parent/guardian and then returned to me on Mondays.
3. This goes into the grade book as a graded assignment.
